Singapore convened the Special ASEAN Ministerial Meeting on Climate Action (SAMCA) and Expanded-SAMCA (E-SAMCA) on 10 July 2018 with the ASEAN Plus Three, UNFCCC Executive Secretary, ASEAN Secretary-General, and UNFCCC COP current President and President-designate Fiji and Poland. At the meeting, Singapore announced the launch of a Climate Action Package to develop the region's capacity in climate action.

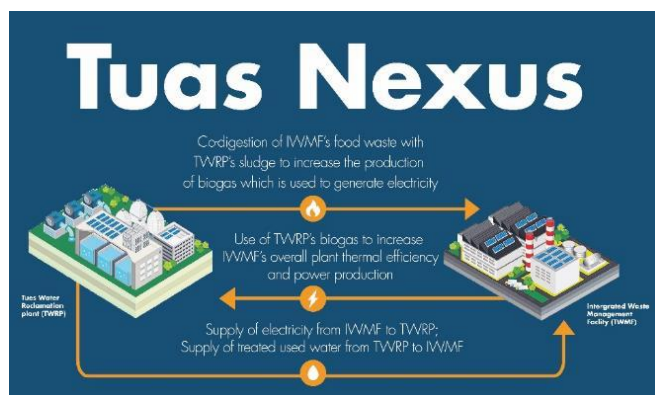
